AIPES is an academic program sponsored by The Fund for American Studies, Georgetown University and Charles University that is designed to explore the political, economic and cultural issues of the world as it grows under democratic principles. Students gather to study the basic foundations of a free society, and are encouraged to apply these concepts to the transitions taking place in their home countries. For three weeks, students will attend classes, participate in a parliamentary simulation, listen to prominent speakers, and attend special events designed to engage them in an educational, cultural and social exchange.

- **European Journalism Institute (July 10 – July 19, 2009)**

In the summer of 2009, join working journalists and journalism students together for a unique one-week seminar in Prague, the Czech Republic. The European Journalism Institute (EJI) will be held for a week in July in conjunction with the three-week American Institute on Political and Economic Systems (AIPES) Institute also sponsored by The Fund for American Studies (TFAS).

Institute participants gather to study the basic structure and functions of market economics in the context of such fundamental issues as competition, the role of government in the economy, environmental regulation, globalization, the functions of the price system, health and welfare economics and international

trade. Participants will also discuss strategies on how to accurately report on news stories dealing with business, the economy, and fiscal policies.

Instructors and guest lecturers are drawn from the United States and Europe. Lecturers include economics and public policy experts, journalists who cover business and finance, and government and corporate leaders. Those selected to attend EJI will receive a full generous scholarship to attend the institute.

- **The Global Leadership Program (July 1 – August 2, 2009)**

Founded in the year 2000 in collaboration with the Global Institute for Leadership and Civic Development, is a program concentrating on current world issues, leadership, issues of global importance and the non-governmental sector. The 10th Annual Global Leadership Program is a comprehensive four-week program that includes: university courses, cultural activities, and community service. The pro-

gram is open to undergraduate university students from around the world. Each year approximately 40 students are offered a mixture of classroom and community activities, led by a team of younger professors from the USA and Central Europe. Participants are offered specially designed courses which focus on issues of global importance. Each course is both interactive and challenging. Participants obtain an introduction to leadership during the Philosophies of Leadership course.

- **European Summer School 2009 (ESS 2009)**  
**(July 11 – July 21, 2009)**

The EUROPEUM Institute for European Policy associated with the Jean Monnet Center of Excellence in European Studies at the Faculty of Social Sciences of Charles University has teamed up once again to organize a summer school, which will discuss economic, legal and political challenges of enlarging European Union.

The European Summer School 2009 (ESS 2009) "**TransAtlantic Relations from the Perspective of Central Europe**" focuses on similarities and differences in policies and approaches of the European Union and its member states and the United States of America. The courses will emphasize the particular situations of Central European countries (Czech Republic, Poland, Hungary and Slovakia) and try to answer the question to which extent the division of **Old Europe and New Europe** remained. Participants of the ESS 200 **will learn and discuss** the different issues of individual policies.

*Workshop 2: Transatlantic market and WTO issues, including trade in agricultural products and agricultural policies*
